

# Our 2017/19 reach and impact

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Over 8,000 individuals supported with an increase in complex cases requiring more intensive support

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*\*Complex cases: When an individual receives support for two or more presenting issues.*



100,000 estimated individuals supported through our wider reach\*

*\*Wider reach: As well as supporting individuals directly, School-Home Support also provides training, supervision, and other pastoral development services to non-SHS staff, who go on to support more children, young people, and families. Thus, the expertise and experience of SHS benefits more individuals across the country.*



*We work with the most deprived pupils in England: 75% based in highest poverty areas\**

*\*Three-quarters of the schools we work in are based in boroughs with a poverty rate of 28% or above, with 27 schools located in London boroughs with the highest poverty rates.*

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The difference we make to attendance and attainment  
2 years intensive support from an SHS practitioner >  
46 extra days in school (on average) per pupil per year\* >  
18% rise in the likelihood of achieving 5 A\*-C grades\*\*

*\*These results based on a subset of pupils whose families received intensive support from SHS over a period of two school years September 2016 - July 2018*

*\*\*DfE research shows that the likelihood of achieving a level 5 or above at GCSE is affected proportionally by 0.4% per half day absence ([The link between absence and attainment at KS2 and KS4 2013/14 academic year](#))*

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 **£818** 1x tailored SHS plan (per child per year)

The cost of SHS  
£818 = 1 x tailored SHS plan (per child per year)\*

*\*Based on £36,000 annual cost for one F/T SHS Practitioner divided by average number of children and young people who received intensive support per FTE practitioner in 2017/18*
